



What is perinatal mental health?

Perinatal mental health refers to the direct relationship between a person's mental health experience and their pregnancy and/or postpartum period, which is defined as one year after birth. The data reveals that untreated mental health conditions carry various risks for the expectant patient and baby.

Introducing the perinatal outpatient mental health clinic

The perinatal outpatient mental health clinic pilot project will support perinatal patients experiencing mental health challenges through pregnancy (from 12 weeks' gestation) to one-year post-partum.

Operating from the Misericordia Mother Rosalie Health Services Centre, the clinic provides timely, accessible and evidence-based treatment for people experiencing mental health challenges directly related to their perinatal experience.

The interdisciplinary team, consisting of two psychiatrists, mental health nurses, a clinical social worker and spiritual care will provide accessible, evidence-based support, including, but not limited to:

- Initial intake and treatment planning between the mental health clinician and the patient
- One-to-one support with mental health clinician
- Perinatal groups that provide Dialectical Behaviour Therapy (DBT)-focused psychoeducation
- Drop-in support groups, where the perinatal patients and their babies are welcome
- Social work, spiritual care and psychiatry consultations



Patient eligibility criteria

Inclusion criteria

- 18 years of age or older
- Has primary care physician in community
- 12 weeks pregnant to one-year post-partum

Exclusion criteria

- Under 18 years of age
- Primary addictions disorder
- If a patient has an existing psychiatrist, a perinatal psychiatric consultation will not be offered. Psychiatrist to psychiatrist consult may be arranged. However, the patient can be referred for all other programs offered by the perinatal outpatient mental health clinic.
- Third-party assessments (e.g. lawyer/court, child welfare, WCB, AISH)

Referral process

The perinatal outpatient mental health clinic is accepting referrals from:

- Emergency department physicians/psychiatrists at the MCH and GNCH
- Obstetricians, physicians, psychiatrist and midwives with admitting and/or birthing privileges at MCH and GNCH
- NICU staff/social workers at the MCH and GNCH
- Nurses working in the programs mentioned above
