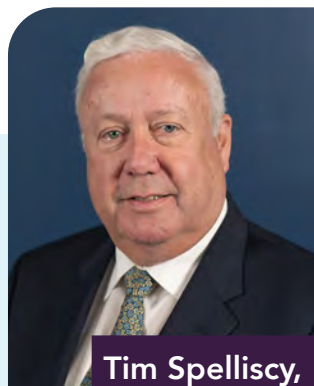
In the past year, we expanded community-based care, strengthened partnerships with Indigenous communities and rural regions and advanced our vision to create vibrant communities of health and healing.

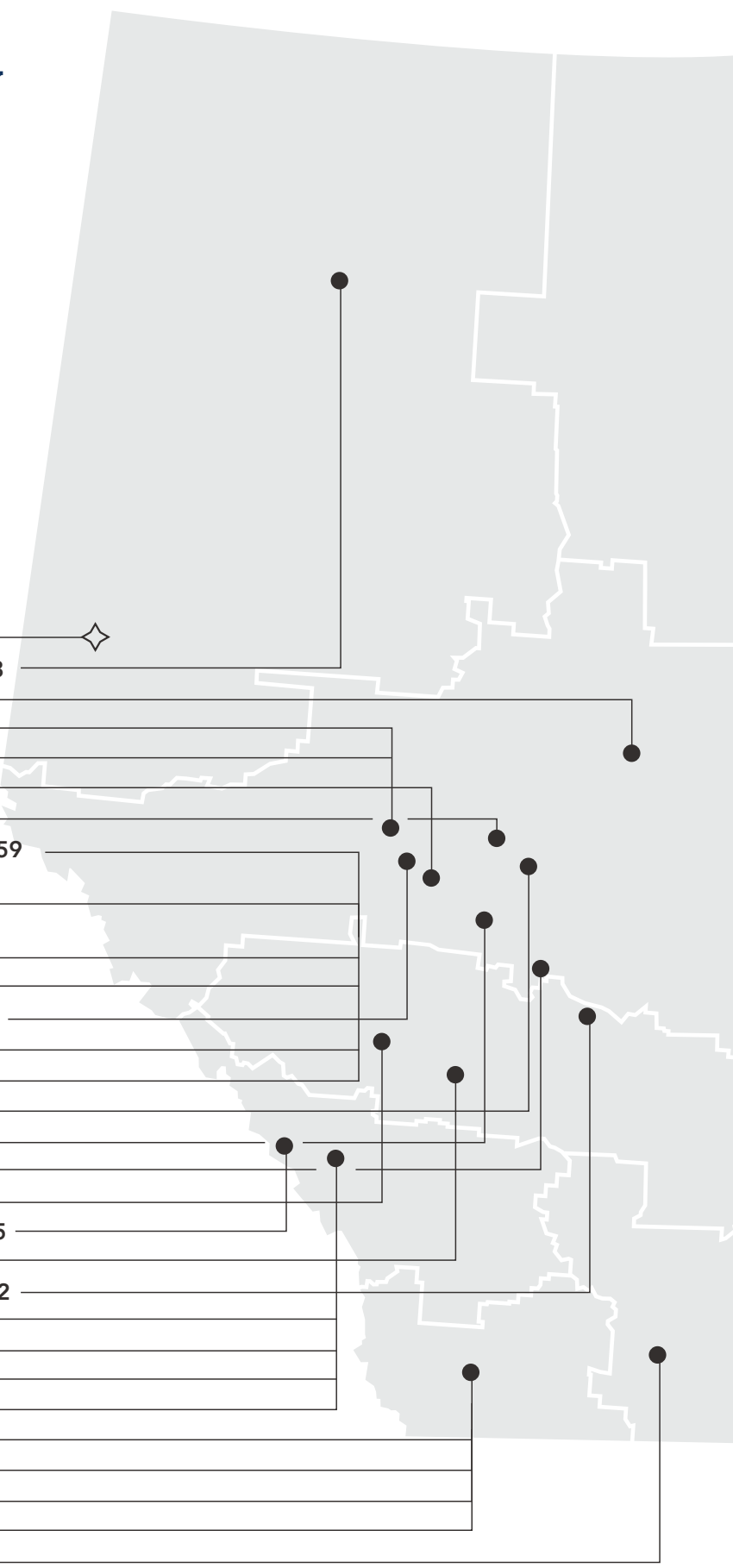

Highlights of the year

Building for tomorrow and strengthening today

Covenant has invested in both infrastructure and people — laying the foundation for future growth while empowering our teams to lead with compassion and care.

Empowering our workforce at its core

Over 400 employees took part in workforce engagement sessions designed to bring out the best in our leadership team. Core Communications sessions helped equip our leaders to effectively empower their teams to live Covenant's mission and pursue our strategic priorities.

Big investments, bigger impact for two Edmonton hospitals

Major government funding is setting the stage for future growth at the Grey Nuns and Misericordia community hospitals. Planning is now underway for new towers at both sites, each adding 350 more beds. These expansions will strengthen capacity and position Covenant to deliver even more care to Edmonton families for years to come.

Advancing rural health across Alberta

Over the past year, Covenant supported rural communities with new training programs and health services close to home.

Mobile training, local impact

A mobile simulation program is delivering life-saving training to some of Alberta's most remote communities. These high-impact sessions are building local capacity and improving emergency response when every second counts. This essential work is made possible through the support of Covenant Foundation and the generous donors who believe in better care, closer to home.



Breaking ground, building community

The future of rural health is taking shape in Trochu. This new Covenant development will offer modern long-term care and vital health services, keeping seniors close to loved ones and delivering care where it's needed most.

La Crete's health future starts now

A new maternity and community health centre is on the horizon for La Crete. Designed to meet the growing needs of this vibrant northern community, the facility will bring care closer to home when it opens in 2027.

Transforming care in community

Covenant Wellness Community is a new model for integrated health and wellness. This past year, Covenant reached major milestones, building momentum for the opening of the first phase of this innovative development in southeast Edmonton.



Bringing future community-based care to life

More than 650 people came together in southeast Edmonton to celebrate Covenant Wellness Community — Lakewood and the anticipated opening of the Community Health Centre in fall 2025. With music, food trucks and behind-the-scenes tours, the event sparked excitement for a bold new vision of community care — right in the heart of the neighbourhood.

\$4M gift puts families first

A visionary \$4 million donation from a Covenant Foundation donor is bringing a primary care clinic to life at the Covenant Wellness Community — Lakewood in southeast Edmonton. Set to open in 2026, the clinic in the new Community Health Centre will help ensure people can access a variety of health and wellness services in a single visit. This new space will expand access to care for thousands of families and further empower people to live and age well in the community.

A new beginning at the Community Health Centre

This year marked a meaningful milestone in our vision to bring care closer to where people live, work and connect. In spring 2025, Covenant Health received the keys to the new Community Health Centre — the first phase of Covenant Wellness Community — Lakewood in southeast Edmonton.

Momentum continues to build. With construction complete and final preparations underway, we're working closely with tenants to prepare the space for opening. The three-storey, 190,000-square-foot centre will offer a vibrant mix of services — including health clinics, diagnostic imaging, food vendors and flexible spaces for community use — all designed to support wellness, connection and inclusive access.

The Community Health Centre represents a powerful promise: to bring health care into the heart of neighbourhoods, to reflect the culture and energy of the community and to lead in delivering integrated, community-based care across Alberta.

As we prepare to open in fall 2025, our hearts are full of gratitude — for the donors who shared this vision, the partners who made it possible and the community that continues to inspire every step forward.

The future of care is already taking shape, and it feels like home.

Responding with skill, leading with compassion

Every second counts in emergency care — and so does compassion. At Covenant, our teams in acute and emergency settings respond not just with clinical excellence but with calm and kindness. Whether navigating high-pressure trauma cases or pioneering new protocols, they save lives and restore trust in critical moments.

Over the past year, the Misericordia Community Hospital marked one year of operations in its new emergency department, where more patients now receive timely care in a space designed to support both physical and mental health needs. We celebrated the leadership of physicians like Dr. Fasika Aklilu, who advocates for equity and diversity while leading in crisis. And we trained emergency teams across our sites using simulation protocols for life-threatening hemorrhages.

Advancing care through innovation and precision

Innovation isn't just about new tools. It's about creating better experiences and better outcomes. At Covenant, clinical innovation and research go hand-in-hand with compassionate care. Our teams are leading the way in minimally invasive procedures, robotics and evidence-based medicine that can improve recovery and transform lives.

At the Misericordia Community Hospital, new technologies like the Acesa procedure are offering less invasive fibroid treatment options. And at the Grey Nuns Community Hospital, researchers like Dr. Jesse Siffledeen are advancing gastroenterology care through clinical trials with national impact.

These innovations show how Covenant continues to drive innovative solutions, ensuring that every breakthrough enhances the patient journey — from diagnosis to recovery.

From infancy to older adulthood, wellness is a lifelong journey. Covenant supports people at every stage of life with care programs that promote safety, independence and dignity. This year, we focused on expanding preventative health care and strengthening mental wellness supports, especially for seniors and families.

Targeted mobility programs at Evanston Summit are helping seniors stay active and prevent falls. In our neonatal intensive care units, families receive the tools they need to bring their babies home safely. And across care sites, teams are receiving specialized training to reduce suicide risk in older adults — a critical and often overlooked need.

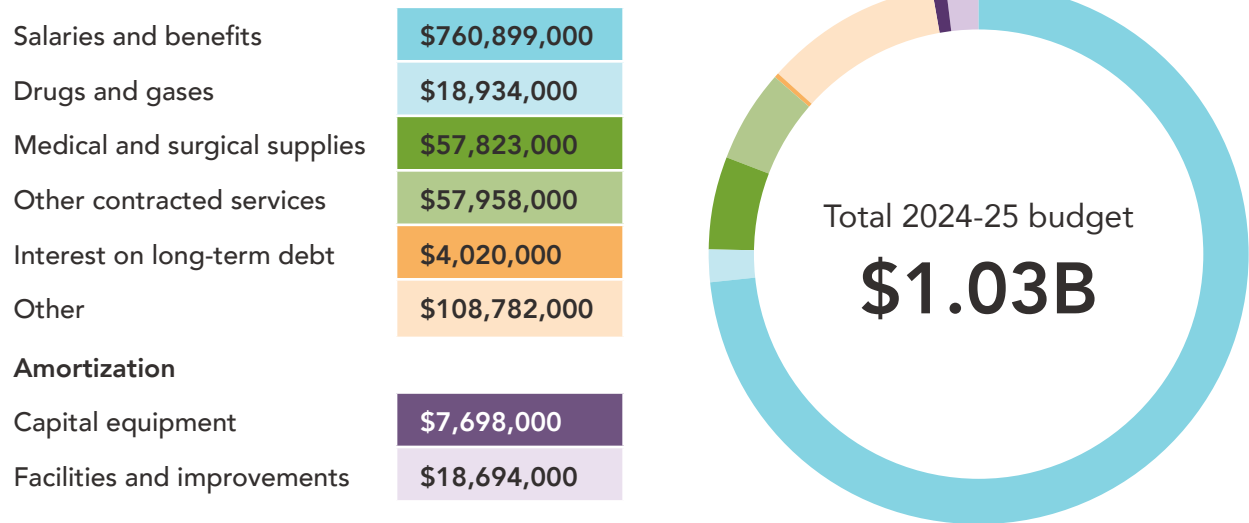

Public interest disclosure report

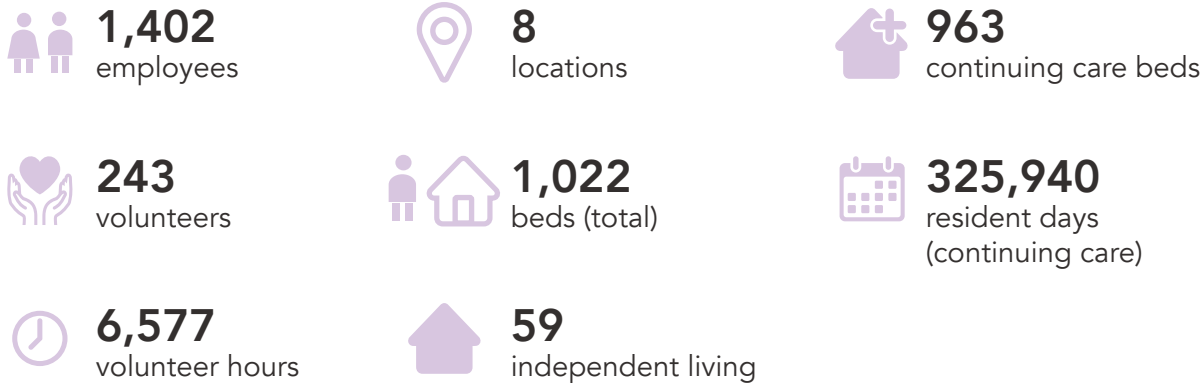

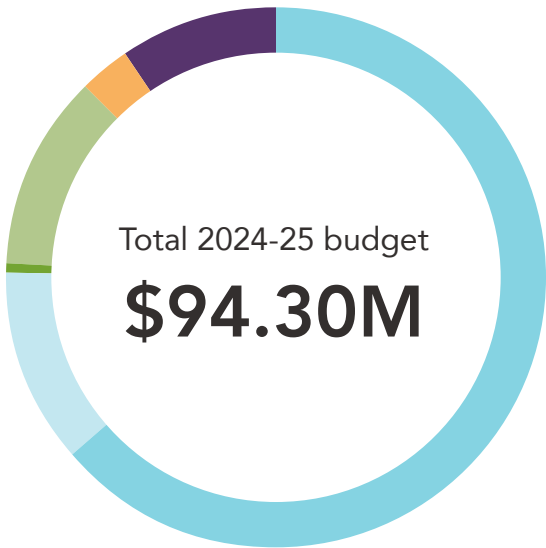
